hands cracked, body bent, yet rising to glean scraps for his family.

In Minneapolis, the bereaved father kneeling by a memorial cross,
heart shattered by racial violence, pleading for justice in the streets of unrest.

In Kyiv, the soldier huddled in a frozen trench under missile fire,
tormented by separation from his family, questioning the cost of defense.
What the one feels, we all feel.

In Myanmar, the displaced villager fleeing junta raids through jungles,
feet blistered, spirit crushed by repression, longing for a dawn of freedom.
What the one feels, we all feel.

In Sudan, the famine-struck child with swollen belly in a refugee camp,
too weak to cry, arms outstretched for the aid that has been cut off.
